COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

PGMC 101 - History of Golf

This course exposes students to an in-depth study of the history of golf from the global beginnings of stick-and-ball games to golf in Scotland, its spread around the world and its explosion in the USA. It involves a continuous, systematic narrative of how golf originated, its phases of evolution, and the people, ideas or events that shaped the course of golf development. Golf's inclusivity and its social- and economic-class history will be discussed within a chronological format.

PGMC 102 - The Rules/ Etiquette of Golf

This course exposes students to the Rules and etiquette of golf (Player's version of the 2023 Rules as per R& A and USGA). The main discussion focuses on the 25 Rules in the 10 sections of the current Rules. How the rules came to be established, the changes in the game of golf and golf rules over time, and information up to the current rules will be discussed. Students will also learn how the Rules apply in general golf play and in tournament golf. They will be tested on the rules of golf in hypothetical situations.

PGMC 103 - Sports Psychology

Students are exposed to sports psychology, specifically from a coach's perspective. Coaching philosophy, the importance of communication and mental skills training will be discussed. Students will also learn the concepts of imagery, relaxation, self-talk, motivation, energy- and stress-management, improving self-confidence and making mental plans.

PGMC 105 - Golf and Club Facilities Operations Management

Students are exposed to the basic principles of managing all types of clubs. Topics include types of clubs, general manager role and leadership, strategic planning, effective communication, club and membership marketing, managing

human resources, professional development, club operations including food and beverage, club financial management, the use of technology, club facility management, entertainment, golf operations, golf course maintenance, fitness, spa, aquatics, and tennis. Additionally, students are exposed to the concepts of golf-specific Strategic Vision, Tactical Plan, and Operational Execution, as well as the assessment of operational success.

PGMC 109 - Tournament Operations

Students are introduced to the fundamentals of golf tournament operations for charity fundraisers and corporate golf outings. Topics include planning the venue, making the committees, planning fundraising goals and budget, acquiring sponsorships, marketing, and planning event format.

PGMC 204 - Turfgrass Management

This course teaches students the essentials of turfgrass establishment, maintenance and management. It includes grass-variety selection, soil requirements, site preparation, mowing and irrigation techniques and equipment, and the treatment of weeds, insects and disease. Golf course-specific concepts are also discussed.

PGMC 206 - Golf Club Design, Manufacturing, and Fitting

This course exposes students to the fundamentals of golf club design, the important clubhead, shaft and grip variables, and how to properly fit clubs to the needs of the customer. It also provides information on club repair, and the manufacturing process of cast and forged clubheads, and steel and graphite shafts. Advances in club materials will also be discussed.

PGMC 207 - Golf Course Architecture and Design

This course teaches the fundamentals of golf course design. It exposes students to the essentials of how to plan and design a course taking into consideration the given landscape. The first three phases of golf course design are introduced,

i.e., the site-analysis, schematic-design and design- development phases. Specific hole designs are covered as are the special requirements of tees, fairways, hazards/penalty areas and greens.

PGMC 208 - Golf Coaching (4 units)

This course exposes students to the coaching of golf at the high school and college level. It also explains basic golf instruction in general group settings. Students will understand the difference between golf coaching and teaching and how to develop their own coaching philosophy. They will also be provided information on the qualities of a great coach including the ability to communicate and motivate, the mental game, course management, good practice planning, how to build a successful golf program, and the basic fundamentals that beginner golfers should be taught.

PGMC 228 – Principles of Fitness Training – General and Golf Specific

Students will first be exposed briefly to important aspects of general fitness training, human physiology and the stabilization, strength and power phases of training. Students will then be exposed to golf-specific fitness training information. Information on how to screen and then train golfers to enhance their golf performance-specific fitness are provided. Current training trends in the golf fitness industry as well as research findings on the same are discussed. Students are also exposed to fitness training for special populations.

PROGRAM INFORMATION (ELIGIBILITY AND RULES FOR ADMISSION)

- > The Golf Management Certificate program is a 50 week fully online program consisting of 10 courses with a duration of five weeks each.
- The curriculum is designed to expose current and future golf leaders to all the many different fields of knowledge required to be successfully hired in the golf industry.
- > New cohorts with a minimum of 20 students per cohort will be admitted 5 times per year.

Medium of Instruction

The English language will be used for both instruction and examination.

Eligibility for Admission

1. The candidate must have a minimum level of education of a High School certificate, a GCE "A" Level certificate or equivalent for acceptance.

While English language proficiency is not a requirement of the course, it will be extremely important for the candidate to have adequate proficiency for a program that will only be conducted in the English Language.

Rules for Admission

- It is the responsibility of the candidate to follow all admissions rules procedures.
- The registration form must be completed and submitted a minimum of 30 days before the desired start date of the program.
- All certificates (see requirements in Eligibility for Admission section) must be submitted at the time of registration.

Fee Payment Rules

- The complete course fees (currently United States Dollars 7,200) are required to be paid a minimum of 20 days before the desired start date of the program.
- Six or seven text books will be required to be used by students. The cost of those text books is not included in the above course fee.
